Note

2. Students who take any credits from master degree offered by Executive Class Section will not be considered as graduation credits.
3. The elective courses on this Course Outline may be counted toward total graduation credits by students who entered the university prior to the 2013 academic year.
4. Students may choose one out of the two and two out of three electives listed on this Course Outline as (a) required course(s). Only one(two) course(s) will be considered as required if students choose both(three) electives.
5. Only students who pass the master degree examination and meet requirements of graduate study will be eligible for receiving the degree. The minimum credits (both required and elective credits) for receiving the degree is 43, not including the 6 credits for thesis.
